

RoHS EXEMPTION

REGARDING:

Compliance of Pyromation products to Restriction of Hazardous Substances (RoHS) – Directive 2002/95/EC and Amendment 2005/747/EC

Pyromation declares that its products are exempt from RoHS regulation due to the fact that they belong to Category 9, Monitoring and Control Instruments of Electrical and Electronic Equipment (EEE). Exemption is further supported as the products are commonly a component of “large-scale stationary industrial tools” defined in Category 6, Electrical and Electronic Tools.

The RoHS Regulations only apply to EEE which falls within categories 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 10 of the ten categories in Schedule 1 of the WEEE Regulations listed below:

1. Large household appliances
2. Small household appliances
3. IT and telecommunications equipment
4. Consumer equipment
5. Lighting equipment including light bulbs and luminaries in households
6. Electrical and electronic tools (with the exception of large-scale stationary industrial tools)
7. Toys, leisure and sports equipment
8. Medical devices (with the exception of all implanted and infected products)
9. Monitoring and control instruments
10. Automatic dispensers
